

Communication, Language and Literacy

Teaching will continue to focus on helping children to discriminate sounds as well as exploring rhyme and alliteration. Games will also provide opportunities for children to blend sounds orally. They will have opportunities to recognise their name in print and be introduced to writing their name. Children will listen to lots of stories, poems and rhymes.

Mathematics

In this half term the focus is shape, number composition, what comes before/after and revisiting numbers to 5. We will explore these concepts through first hand experiences, songs and rhymes. We will continue to focus on counting and subitising small numbers.

Understanding the World

The focus will be on schools and friends. Children will explore this through stories and role play. Children will continue to go to Forest School and will have opportunities to observe seasonal changes in the outside areas of the school. We will continue to use technology to support our learning, such as engaging with 'Tapestry talk time'.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The focus this half term is 'transition to school'. Children will look at and talk about pictures of their new teachers and schools (displayed in classroom for constant access). Children will share books about school and what school is like. We continue to play with our friends, talking about how to take turns and share.

Physical Development

Children will continue to develop their gross motor skills through a variety of resources in the environment. Targeted finger gym activities will support fine motor skills. We will explore different ways to keep safe and moving around in the environment. Children will begin to explore the other playgrounds on site.

Expressive Arts

We will model and provide opportunities for roleplay in the 'fruit market'. Children will be asked to talk about their drawings, paintings and other creations. Further Rhymes and songs link to the maths curriculum.
